
Temptations to Sin

[Jesus] said to his disciples, "Temptations to sin are sure to come, but woe to the one through whom they come! 



OCTOBER 2022 LWML MISSION GRANT

Taking the Gospel to the Ends of the Earth

"Ends of Earth" Scholarships Mission Opportunities Short Term (MOST) Ministraies — \$50,000

Mission Opportunities Short Term (MOST) Ministries is a Recognized Service Organization (RSO) of the LCMS. In response to Jesus words in Acts 1:8, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth", MOST Ministries has sent mission teams throughout the United States and 52 countries around the world for the past 32 years. Some of these countries include Uganda, Tanzania, Kenya, Ethiopia, Ghana, South Africa, Thailand, Peru, and Sri Lanka.

MOST Ministries teams impact the world for Jesus by providing opportunities for individuals to be part of a hands-on mission team. They are field driven as they connect with LCMS missionaries and national church leaders in the field to assess ministry needs and develop and plan team projects. Teams are equipped to share the love of Jesus as they fit people with eyeglasses, build churches/schools, provide medical/dental care and health education, teach women marketable skills like sewing, or provide youth outreach through VBS, sports, music, or English language camps.

As part of their preparation to go into the field, team members need to raise the funds that will support their mission trip. They use personal funds and reach out to family and friends in the body of Christ for support. The average cost for participants ranges from \$3,000 to \$4,000 depending on the country they will serve. During a five-year period, there were twenty-four mission team trips cancelled due to a lack of team members. People were unable to raise the funds needed for their travel and service. The increasing travel costs are a hindrance to those willing to serve on mission teams.

The grant of \$50,000 for MOST Ministries will provide scholarships that will cover up to half of the travel costs for mission team members needing financial assistance. With these scholarships, MOST Ministries will be able to send more mission teams to the ends of the earth to proclaim the Gospel through service and love alongside the missionaries and church leaders serving in these countries. This grant will help MOST Ministries to reach their goal "to impact the world for Jesus Christ, through short term missions".

TODAY is LWML SUNDAY. A bulletin insert is attached to today's bulletin identifying the LWML national mission projects for 2021-2023. Mites for these missions are being collected today next to the pillar in the narthex. Additional mite boxes are available for anyone wishing to collect coins (or dollars) for our mite collection Sunday in November. Mite boxes for children are also available for any children who may wish to contribute.

We also recognize the work of the district LWML as a portion of our mite collection is forwarded on to the mission projects recently approved during the district convention in June. Immanuel's own Dorcas LWML society contributed to national and local projects during the previous year by providing 600 back packs of weekend food items for local school children, completed 117 quilts which will be delivered to the Orphan Grain Train drop off point, sewn and delivered 168 pillowcase dresses to the Orphan Grain Train drop off point, and packaged and delivered 92 tote bags of diapers, wipes and formula to Rolla Pregnancy Resource Center. Bibles continue to be marked for prison ministry and diapers using recycled t-shirts continue to be made for Orphan Grain Train.
