

Sunday School Lesson Summaries:

UNIT 5

God Leads His Nation:

April 02, Lesson 13:

In today's lesson, "The Wise King," when God invites Solomon to ask for what he desires most. Solomon prays for wisdom to carefully lead the people. Pleased with this selfless request, God grants Solomon great wealth and honor in addition to his desired wisdom. Solomon wrote and collected many of the wisdom writings that make up the Book of Proverbs.

April 16, Lesson 14:

"The Unwise Wise King" is the title of today's lesson. Solomon gathers the supplies and artisans to begin the most important construction project of his reign—building a house for God. Using the very finest materials and most craftsmen. Solomon builds a temple so glorious that none to come after it would ever compare. Later in his life, Solomon's many wives and concubines lead him away from the true God. In His anger, God vows to take the kingdom away from Solomon's descendants.

Some History from The Past:

1925: The board of Assignments at Concordia declared that this new Pastor must reside in Rolla where the mission possibilities were better. Rev. Edmund F. Schildt was assigned as the first residential Shepherd to Immanuel Lutheran Church. Pastor

Schildt wrote: In Rolla we worshiped in the Presbyterian Church. The congregation in Rolla was organized, but did not have a church edifice however the congregation of Rolla resolved to build their own house of worship. We canvassed the congregation for volunteer workers and among those who worked on the church building were Emil Mesko and Billy Mitchell as brick layers. Emil Mesko's eldest son also had a hand in laying block and brick. The only son of Mr and Mrs Fritz Duerr mixed the "mud" for the brick layers. Henry Haas was the foremen of the carpenters, and among those who worked with him were his uncle William and his cousins. Henry Benad came with horses and plows and scrapers and wagons to dig out the basement. Quite a number of members of the church gave a hand in the work. Sometime later, they resolved to build a parsonage. The work was also undertaken by volunteer workers of the church, and a basement was dug.
