

Sunday School Lesson Summaries:

UNIT 5

God Leads His Nation:

Feb 05, Lesson 5:

"The Downfall Wall" is the title of this week's lesson. Confident in their wall, the people of Jericho shut themselves up inside the city. Following God's unusual battle plan, Joshua gathers the priests, trumpets, ark of the covenant, and people. Six days they once around the city, then seven times on the seventh day, giving a shout at the conclusion of the least circuit. The city walls come tumbling down, and the Israelites wipe out the citizens and livestock while plundering precious metals for the tabernacle. Yet Rehab and her family are spared.

Feb 12 Lesson 6:

The account of Deborah serves as today's lesson. "The Palm-Tree Judge," Judge Deborah urges Barak to gather 10,000 troops to go up against Sisera's army of 900 iron chariots. When the battle turns against Sisera, he flees on foot, seeking refuge in Jael's tent. Snoozing beneath a rug, Sisera meets his end at the hand of Jael as she pegs him through his temple to the ground.

Feb 19, Lesson 7:

Today, we will study "The Weakened Judge." God grants Samson great strength in defeat the enemies of God's people. Seeking to overcome Samson, the Philistines bribe Delilah to find the source of Samson's strength. Samson deceives Delilah each time she tries to uncover the secret, but he finally reveals the key to his power. Shorn and blinded by the Philistines,

Samson is brought to entertain thousands of revelers at the feast to Dagon. Identifying the house's supporting pillars, Samson prays, and God grants him power to bring down the temple, killing everyone.

Feb 26, Lesson 8:

Today's lesson. "The Faith-Full Family," tells of Ruth's loyalty to her widowed mother-in-law, Naomi. Returning to Naomi's ancestral home in Bethlehem, Ruth gleans Boaz's fields to provide food for herself and Naomi. Ruth finds favor with Boaz, who purchases Naomi's land and redeems Ruth from her widowhood. Having married Boaz, Ruth bears a son, Obed, the grandfather of King David.

Some History from The Past:

1884:

Pease, Elk Prairie church was established by several families of German heritage. Led by Johann Friedrich Haas. They built the "little white church" in 184 officially named Peace Lutheran Church, Elk Prairie. Rev. George Mueller from St. James served as the first pastor. There were about 10 families in the initial membership including the Haas, Sachs and Benads extended families. Mr. Haas was leader of this effort.

The pastor who served Elk Prairie used to stop in Rolla to preach to the faithful Lutheran here. The earliest recordings of assembly of Lutherans in Rolla were in 1866 with Candidate C. Friedrich Lieb who established a meeting place in a local theater.

Here are a few of the pastors who served the Rolla Area before the first Immanuel constitution:

1892- 1894, Pastor George A. Mueller from Elk Prairie 1898- 1900, Pastor Theodor Siek, who died in a hotel fire in St. James.

1909-1914, Pastor Karl Haller, who lived with the Haas family, met with the Lutheran in the Rolla Presbyterian Church and "paid" rent for the church with firewood.

1914-1917, Rev. Ottomer Krueger, lived in the parsonage across from Peace, Elk Prairie. The congregation at Elk Prairie had lost some of its membership to other congregation due in part to the language barrier since services were in German. Pastor Krueger wrote the original Immanuel Lutheran Church Constitution. He left in 1917. This was during WW1 which was hard times for churches as well as the country.
